

#### **Interpretation: The Two Birth Narratives**

- The story about the birth of Jesus is found in only two of the four gospels – Matthew and Luke.
- The two stories have similarities, such as Jesus is born in Bethlehem and the family make their home in Nazareth.
- The two stories have differences, such as the shepherds in Luke and the wise men in Matthew.
- This is because each of the gospel writers interpreted the story of Jesus in a way that highlighted what was important to them as a writer.

- Justice for all is a Muslim story which affirms that no one is above the justice of Allah.

### Salvation: What difference does the resurrection make?

- Christians believe that God needs to save people. This salvation includes the ongoing restoration of humans' relationship with God.
- The Gospels give accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection.
- Belief in Jesus' resurrection confirms to Christians that Jesus is the incarnate Son of God, but also that death is not the end.
- This belief gives Christians hope for life with God, starting now and continuing in heaven.

- The Kingdom is compared to a feast where all are invited to join in. Not everyone chooses to do so.
- Christians try to extend the Kingdom of God by challenging injustice in their locality and in the world.

#### Gospel: What would Jesus do?

- The Good news is not just about setting a good example and challenging poor behaviour.
- It is that Jesus offers a way to heal the damage done by human sin.
- Jesus' teachings cut across expectations. He favours serving the weak and vulnerable, not making people comfortable.
- Christians believe that they should bring this good news to life in the world in different ways.

### Creation: What do Christians learn from the Creation Story? (Digging deeper)

- Genesis tells how humans spoiled their friendship with God (The Fall).
- This means humans cannot get close to God without Gods help.
- God wants to help people to be close to him, gives them guidelines and offers forgiveness.
- Christians show they want to be close to God through obedience, worship and penitence.



<b>Incarnation:</b>	What is	the Trinity	?
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- Christians believe that God is Trinity:
   Father, Son & Holy Spirit.
- Christians believe that father creates; he sends his son who saves people, the son sends the Holy Spirit to his followers.
- Jesus is seen as revealing what God the Father is like.
- Christians believe that the Holy Spirit is God's power at work in the world today, enabling them to follow Jesus.

### Salvation: Why is it called Good Friday? (Digging Deeper)

- Christians see Holy Week as the culmination of Jesus' earthly life, leading to his death and resurrection.
- The events of Holy Week were important in showing the disciples what Jesus came to do.
- Christians trust that Jesus really did rise from the dead and so is still alive today.
- Christians remember and celebrate
   Jesus' last week, death and resurrection.

### **Devotion: Hindu Worship**

- Hindus believe there is one eternal spirit who is called Brahman. Brahman exists in everything.
- Hindu Gods and goddesses have all the different qualities of Brahman.
- The sacred images of the Gods and Goddesses are called murtis.
- Hindus may worship either at home or at the Mandir.
- Hindus may choose one or more Gods to worship and show devotion to.
- They show devotion through arti ceremonies. These are performed with devotion every morning and evening either at the Mandir or at home in front of a shrine.

- Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic year, which has fasting from dawn to sunset.
- Ramadan is followed by the feast of Eidul-Fitr.

#### Incarnation: Was Jesus the Messiah?

- Jesus was Jewish. Christians believe that he was God in the flesh.
- They believe his life was part of a longer plan by God to restore the relationship between humans and God.
- Christians believe that Jesus fulfilled the prophecies of the Old Testament
- Christians believe that Jesus was the Messiah & saviour.

- Debates and controversy relate to interpretations of the text e.g. does Genesis as a poetic account conflict with Science?
- There are many scientists who are/were Christians.
- Scientific discoveries make Christians wonder even more about the power of the creator.

### Salvation: What did Jesus do to save humans?

- Christians understand the 'big story' of the Bible as God needing to 'save' the people, including the ongoing restoration of human's relationship with God.
- Christians understand Jesus' sacrifice as a victory over sin, death and the devil; paying the punishment as a substitute for everyone else's sins – leading them from darkness to light.
- Christians remember Jesus' sacrifice through the Holy Communion.
- Christians believe that Jesus calls them to sacrifice their own needs to the needs of others and some are prepared to die for others or their faith.

### Rites of Passage: Journey of Life
